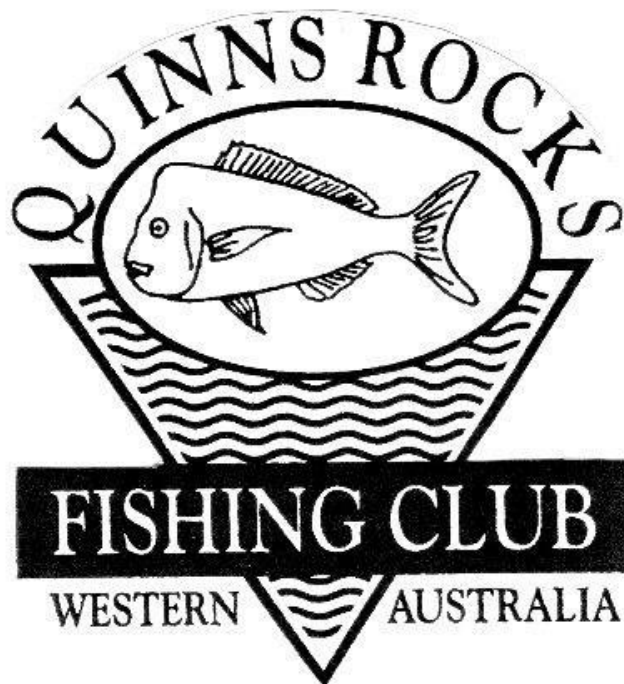

Our Fishery :

Treat all fish humanely.

Quickly and correctly return all undersized and unwanted fish to maximize their chance of survival.

Take no more than your immediate needs.

Value and preserve your catch and keep it cold and in good condition for eating.

Understand and observe all fishing regulations.

Use only legal fishing tackle and attend to your gear.

Our Environment :

Where ever you go, do not leave litter anywhere.

Use rubbish bins when available, or take rubbish away with you to prevent pollution and protect our wildlife.

Leave the place clean and tidy and take away other people's rubbish if and when possible.

Do Not do anything that will damage the Marine, Coastal and or Land environment.

Our Community :

Respect Local, State and National laws and rules.

Respect the rights of property and land owners and the rights of others.

Observe the rules of common courtesy whenever fishing or travelling.

Try not to overcrowd and do leave room for fellow anglers.

Offer Aid and assistance wherever it is needed where it would be helpful and safe.

Inform and encourage other people to adopt a similar code of conduct and to make it enjoyable.

Monthly Competition General Rules 2024/2025

1. As a general rule competitions will be on the 3rd Sunday of each month with the 4th Sunday as a standby date. This may change to cater for demersal ban start and end dates or to avoid special days (eg Mothers Day or public holidays).
2. Timings :
Sign On – Day before or before 30 minutes after the start time.
Start Time - April to September 7am
October to March 6am
Start time for beach anglers is 4pm Saturday (all months)
End Time - Weigh in starts at 4pm and all bags should be in the weigh-in area for the weigh-in start.
3. Competition Fees:
Adults \$5, Juniors (Under 16) \$2.50, Visitors enter for free.
4. All competitors should register on WhatsApp or by text before launching for boat anglers or before you start fishing for beach anglers.
5. **There must be a minimum of 3 boats entering in any one competition**, this no longer has to be within 30 minutes of the start time, competitors can register that they will be starting later than the start time and will be included in the boat count.

A competition will automatically be called off when there is a STRONG WIND WARNING forecast between 4:00 a.m. (the B.O.M's inshore forecast) and midnight

OR

If due to inclement weather or other necessitating circumstances, a competition may be cancelled within 2 hours of the start time at the discretion of the Captain or Angling & Sports committee member(s) after notifying all other competitors.

It is the skippers responsibility of each participating vessel to make themselves aware of the current weather forecast and sea conditions before putting to sea.

6. There will be 3 competition divisions, Men's, Ladies and Juniors (Juniors under the age of 16 at July 1st at the Start of the fishing year).
7. **VISITORS** may enter 3 competitions only. They do not qualify for any of the monthly prizes but accrue points towards the annual competition when joining the QRFC. The points will be added to the Anglers overall points for the fishing year.
8. There are 5 Trophy divisions; A. Club Champion (Overall), B. Men's, C. Ladies, D. Juniors, E. The biggest of each of the species as listed by the Angling & Sports Committee. (Biggest fish species will include Men's, Ladies, Junior's).
9. **Weighable species:**
Only 1 (one) of each species as listed in the A&S list within the Fisheries Dept. possession limits.

Anglers to refer to the A&S list of eligible species for weighable species, category and minimum sizes for competition days.

Miscellaneous Rules

The following rules should be adhered to, if any of these rules are broken then the fish that broke the rule may be excluded from the anglers bag, all remaining fish will still count towards their score.

10.1 No more than **1 fish of any species** should be in your bag to be weighed. If more than 1 is present, that species will not count towards your score.

10.2 A mutilated fish is not eligible for weighing-in, a mutilated fish is by means of piece(s) missing from Shark bites or similar, damaged by boat propeller etc. (this does not include gilled and gutted or cut for bleeding).

10.3 Fish that have their neck broken will be pushed back into original shape and must be 1 cm longer than listed minimum size. This does not apply to gilled and gutted fish or with the throat cut for bleeding.

10.4 Undersized fish as per A&S species list. (A just size fish can shrink about 25mm, so remember to re-check your catch prior to your catch being weighed). Competitors are able (and encouraged) to use the official weigh-in measure prior to the start of the weigh-in when fish were just size when caught.

10.5 Fish presented for weighing-in MUST BE in an INOFFENSIVE STATE. Fish in rotten, badly deteriorated or generally unfit for consumption are considered offensive.

10.6 Each competitor must present their fish in individual wet cloth or hessian bags for weighing-in. (Plastic bags of any form are deemed NOT SUITABLE with the exception of Squid to prevent inking but must be kept cool).

Bags must be clearly labeled with anglers name.

10.7 Squid are to be presented in a A&S provided light gauge plastic bag so all bags can be weighed without prejudice. Squid in A&S plastic bags are also to be kept with the rest of the catch in cool wet cloth or hessian bag.

10.8 Squid/Fish must be caught by hook or Jig before landing.

10.9 Power assisted winches or rods and reels, Set-lines, drop lines, traps or hooks on markers/floats used for finfish fishing are not permitted on any boats.

10.10 Anglers must not use a combination of more than 2 rods/reels/handlines. With the exception of demersal fish each rod or handline must not have more than 2 hooks (snell or gangs count as 1). For demersal rigs only 1 hook is allowed.

10.11 Anglers must hook and land their own catch, but may receive assistance with gaffing, netting, gilling or holding the leader where it does not include controlling a rod and reel or main line when retrieving a fish.

Photo Weigh-In Presentations (Section 11)

- A. Only 1 of each eligible species as specified in the Angling & Sports program may be photographed and not exceed Fisheries daily bag limit.
- B. Photos are to be taken with the photo showing the date and time on the day with the fish shown clearly on a measuring board/mat.
- C. Fish in an Offensive state or Mutilated, are not eligible for any competitions.
- D. Photo to be taken on an appropriate Fisheries measurer or Brag mat showing all measurement's clearly.
- E. Photos of fish are to be viewed by the recorder at the weigh-in.
- F. A photographed fish is worth a total of 10 points and will not be considered for any of the bonus points (heaviest, 2nd heaviest, fish of the day) even if the photo indicates they are larger than the other fish of that species that are weighed. The exception to this is detailed in item 'G' below.
- G. If only 1 of a species is submitted on the day, it will be awarded 10 points as the heaviest of that species.
- H. Anglers must be present at the weigh-in for photographed fish to be eligible.

How points are awarded (section 12)

- A. QRFC monthly competitions are species based.
- B. Division winner(s) will be determined by the angler with the most points on the day. In the event of a draw, anglers will be separated firstly by most species followed by weight if still a draw.

- c. Club records caught on club competition days accrue 10 bonus points. Anglers have 7 days to apply for a club record but DO NOT receive 10 points if not claimed on the day. Fish for club records that are not on the Angling & Sports species list must be presented prior to the start of the weigh-in (Not protected species)

Any member can weigh in a Club Record in any competition event where the club is participating and/or any social or otherwise event supported by the club (Any fish species eligible). (No bonus points added to monthly competition scores)

It is the duty of the competitor(s) to notify the weigh master of a possible Club record to be weighed separately.

- d. Club competitions will be species based and points are awarded as follows:

10 points for each species caught as per QRFC Angling & Sports species list (be aware of Fisheries possession sizes and limits).

10 points will be awarded to each angler entered in the monthly fishing competition.

10 points for the heaviest and 2 points for the second heaviest of each species incl. FOD.

10 points awarded to each angler who catches the nominated Fish of the Day species. 10 points for any club record submitted on the competition day.

- e. Prizes for the winners will be presented on the Friday night after the competition day. (winners must be present at the club to claim any species prizes with the exception of FIFO or shift workers while away/working).
- f. Anglers must weigh-in at least 1 fish from the species list to be eligible for any Divisional prizes.
- g. At the end of the fishing calendar year (June), Anglers best 9 scores will be their total points for the fishing season.

Miscellaneous Information

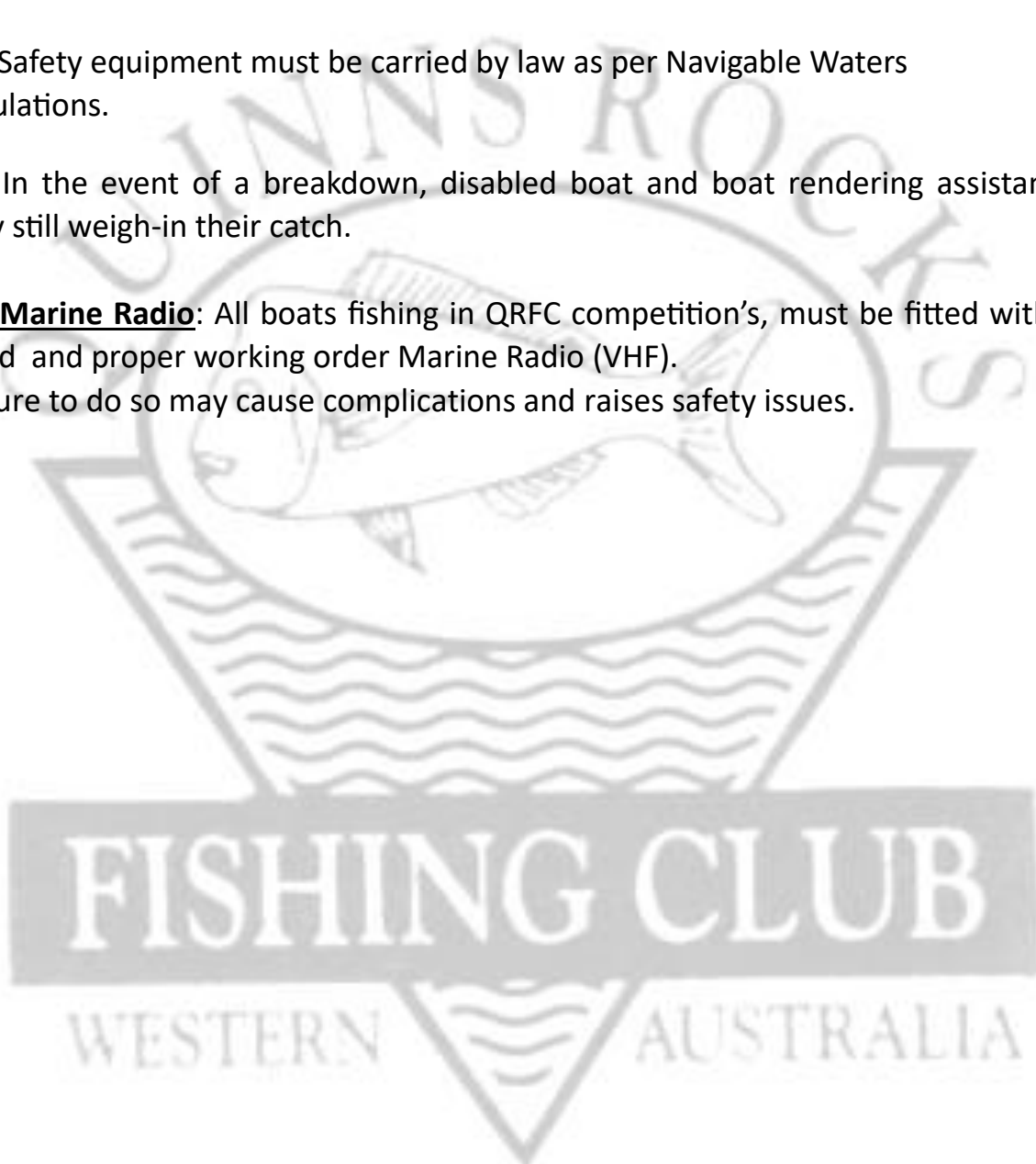
13. Release weights are compulsory when fishing for demersal fish.

14. Cleaning any fish near the launching ramps or around the weigh-in area is not permitted unless collecting fish frames.

15. Safety equipment must be carried by law as per Navigable Waters regulations.

16. In the event of a breakdown, disabled boat and boat rendering assistance may still weigh-in their catch.

17. **Marine Radio**: All boats fishing in QRFC competition's, must be fitted with a good and proper working order Marine Radio (VHF). Failure to do so may cause complications and raises safety issues.



Angling and Sports Nominated Eligible Comp Species.

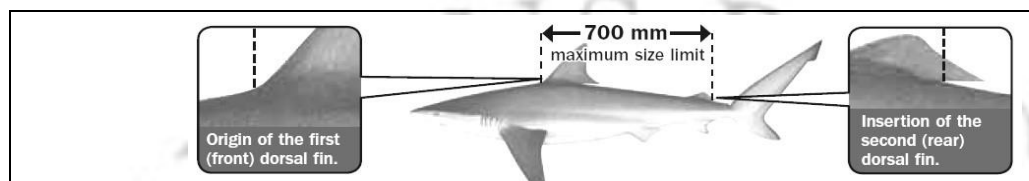

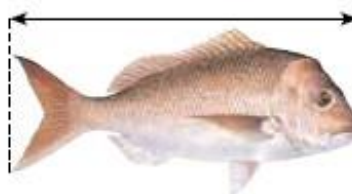

Repeat Station 2 times followed by your call sign. (Talk clearly and slowly)
